Bible-based **LITERACY PROJECT**



A chance encounter has allowed a young girl on the other side of the world to read about God in her family's native language.

Nine-year-old Mila van der Linde lives with her parents in Perth, Australia. They emigrated from South Africa before she was born. She is a Grade 5 learner at Quinns Baptist College and owns two Afrikaans Bibles. Although she can read both, she still needs help as she only started reading Afrikaans in 2023.

The Van der Linde's family friends, Mrs Hanlie Evans and her husband, Jimmy, visited South Africa last year.

Mrs Evans attended a service at their former church led by Ds Johan Peyper. During the service, he mentioned the Bible Society of South Africa (BSSA) has Bible-based literacy

material developed to help children read and write.

Hoping to get hold of some literacy books, Mrs Evans mentioned it to her dear friend, Mrs Annette Zeelie, whose brother, Ds Charl de Kock, is a BSSA employee.

After a couple of telephone calls, Mrs Evans had the booklets in her hands. She took it back to Australia for Mila, who has since started reading Afrikaans fluently, thanks to this gift from the BSSA.

LAUNCH OF ISIZULU REACH4LIFE: A Celebration of Partnerships, Hope and Transformation



On 18 November 2023, the picturesque rural town of Tugela Ferry, KwaZulu-Natal (KZN), became the vibrant setting for the much-anticipated launch of the isiZulu *Reach4Life* programme. The event, brimming with energy and enthusiasm, was masterfully hosted by the charismatic Pastor Monica Moravha, Senior Facilitator at Phakama Africa Community Projects. A captivating dance performance by the Village Youth Group in honour of *Reach4Life* was a special treat.

The occasion was honoured by the presence of esteemed guests, including Chief Ndabezitha Nkosi Kunene and his wife; the Mayor, Dr Sikhakhane; school inspector Mr Buthelezi and Phakama Tugela Ferry Coordinator, Pastor Mduduzi. Bible Society of South Africa (BSSA) CEO, Rev Rodney van Wyk, presented

them with special Bibles on behalf of the BSSA and announced that every attendee would receive a set of Bible-based literacy books, along with information on accessing and downloading free Bible apps in their heart language.

Mr Monaheng Sekese, the manager at Biblica Global Bible Ministry, and Ms Thandeka Nzama, Director of Phakama Africa Community Projects, shared interesting details about their respective organisations and the profound impact of *Reach4Life* in KZN. Ms Nzama also shared insightful results from the prior research conducted with 1 008 students in seven districts in KZN. Key findings included:

- Teens are engaging in high-risk behaviours with limited knowledge of

how to protect themselves.

- There is a mixed spiritual landscape and experience of the Bible.
- Bible engagement correlated strongly with positive beliefs and behaviours.
- Teens are facing multiple barriers in reading the Bible. However, the research suggests that reading the Bible as part of a community programme with teachings from *Reach4Life*, which uses the modern isiZulu 2020 translation, could significantly reduce barriers to the Bible and increase engagement – an outcome that will be measured in the post-programme study.

BSSA Relationship Ambassador, Rev Dr Elliot Sithole, shared information about the work and mission of the BSSA. He also shed light on the isiZulu 2020 Bible translation process. He communicated his experiences as a Bible translator working on the translation project, emphasising the significance of this source-text-orientated and easy-to-read Bible translation.

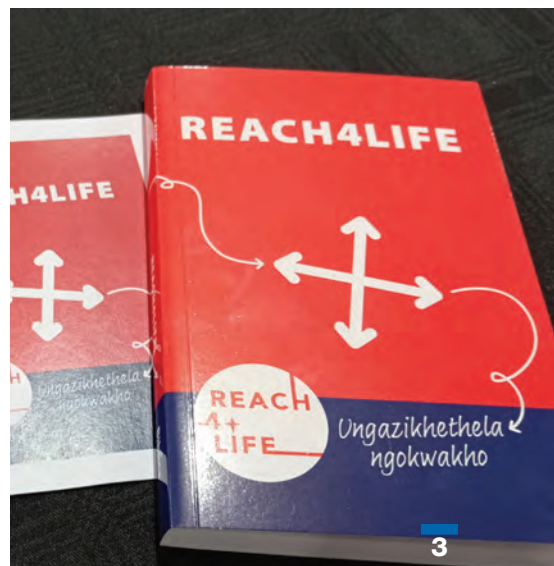
The community's heartfelt testimonies further enriched the event, underscoring the programme's transformative power. Pastor Funeka of Christian Family Church expressed the community's struggle with using English material and the profound impact of having the *Reach4Life* programme and the 2020 Bible translation in isiZulu.

Londiwe, a student at the local high school, shared her journey of overcoming obstacles, completing the programme, and returning to school. She is now leading a *Reach4Life* group.

Another guest in attendance, Pastor Hlongwa, shared inspiring accounts of personal transformation and the potential for prison ministry through the programme.

Launching the *isiZulu Reach4Life New Testament* was not just an event but a celebration of hope. It united a community in their commitment to empowering and uplifting the youth. As the echoes of the event lingered in the air, it was evident that the launch had ignited a beacon of positivity and promise for the future.

Reach4Life is a special edition of the New Testament incorporating a comprehensive 40-week guide for young people with the tools to make wise life choices and deal with challenges, such as the dangers of HIV/AIDS. The programme strongly focuses on evangelism and discipleship, allowing the reader to commit to Christ and develop a life-long relationship with God. IS



INTERVIEW WITH BSSA HEAD OF TRANSLATION



PODCAST

Bible translation is one of the primary functions of the Bible Society of South Africa (BSSA). Making the Bible available to every South African in their heart language is no easy feat, and many do not understand the full scope of the work that goes into translating Bible text.

We sat down with the BSSA's Translation Lead, Dr Masenyani Baloyi, to better understand the inner workings of Bible translation and how important it is to continue serving more language groups with a Bible in their language.

Q: Masenyani, can you tell us when the Bible Society decides to translate a Bible, and how does that process start?

A: The BSSA begins the process of translating a Bible when a church or a specific language community has requested it. Once the BSSA's Executive Board of Directors approves the translation, we look for people who will serve as translators, which is like an interviewing process. Once a team of translators has been established, each member is tasked with doing translation drafts of different Bible books using the Hebrew or Greek

source text under my tutelage. This process is the first stage.

Q: How many more stages follow?

A: Stage two is the editing process, which involves checking whether the language flows and the translation stays faithful to the source text. There are often disagreements regarding context and terminology. As the translation consultant, I am responsible for ensuring the translation is accurate. We then take the translation to a review committee, which completes stage three. Stage four is known as “community testing”.

Q: Why is community testing important?

A: It is essential because languages are complex, and words have different meanings within different dialects. Take Afrikaans as an example; you have someone who speaks and understands Griqua Afrikaans and another who

speaks Orange River Afrikaans, and then you have the “Kaaps” dialect in Cape Town. So, community testing allows us to refine a translation for the specific language community we are serving.

Q: Can you give us an example of how language becomes complicated during the translation process?

A: I can give you an example in Afrikaans, where all the words are different but mean the same thing: “maak propvol”, “maak vol”, “maak hom vol”, “maak hom mooi vol” — the message is the same, but you are using different words and therefore meaning can be interpreted differently.

Another example is that in Hebrew, the word “barak” can mean “to curse”. If I say, “blessed are you”, I’ll use “barak” — but it can also mean you are cursed. So that’s why it’s a complicated and lengthy process, as translating a Bible can take up to 10 years.

Chinese delegation seek **BIBLICAL TRUTH**

In November, the Bible Society of South Africa (BSSA) received a special visit from a Chinese delegation.

The group of six were from the Shanghai Municipal Commission of Ethnic and Religious Affairs. This fact-finding mission aimed to establish ties with the BSSA and learn how it works in an environment of religious diversity.

Rev Dirk Gevers, former CEO of the BSSA and current Secretary General of the United Bible Societies (UBS), also attended the event.

Rev Rodney van Wyk, CEO of the BSSA, gave a presentation which sparked discussions that fake news and the fake representation of Scripture on the internet, are significant challenges. Rev Gevers pointed out

that the UBS are custodians of the correct Biblical text and is a trustworthy source which acts as a guide regarding the legitimacy of material presented in the digital space. 




Presentation of **PEACE BIBLE**

The idea to present a peace Bible to the nations of Ukraine and Russia was conceived at a South African radio station last year.

The Pretoria FM management team approached the Bible Society of South Africa (BSSA) for two Bibles in each of the respective languages. The objective was to present the Bibles to representatives at the South African embassies for Russia and Ukraine. Unfortunately, the plan was not realised. The decision was then made to present the Bibles to Russian and Ukrainian Bible Society representatives.

During the United Bible Societies (UBS) World Assembly in the

Netherlands in October 2023, one of the Bibles was presented to Oleksandr Babychuk, CEO of the Ukrainian Bible Society.

Rev Rodney van Wyk, CEO of the BSSA, and Dr Paul du Plessis, chairman of the BSSA's Board, conducted the presentation.

31 March – 6 April

Colombia: Please pray for the success of the first Wayuunaiki Old Testament translation, which will serve the indigenous population of the Wayuu ethnic group in La Guajira. Pray for the translators and their families and acceptance of the translation. Please also pray for the teachers who train the translators.

Venezuela: The situation in our country remains volatile, and living conditions are incredibly burdensome. Please pray for essential resources such as healthcare, medicine, water and electricity to become accessible. Please pray for the provision of Scripture through Bible translation so the Word of God continues to spread.

Uruguay: Our *Breakfast with Jesus* programme aims to contribute to the nutritional and spiritual development of 10 000 children who live in extreme poverty. By providing snacks and appropriate Scriptures and Bible teachings, we can emphasise the unconditional love of Jesus. Please pray that the children will see the hand of God working in their lives and experience profound transformation.

7 April – 13 April

Argentina: Please pray for translation of the New Testament and Bible stories



from the Old Testament into Argentine Sign Language. Also, pray for our project to offer inclusive publications such as audio Bibles and pictograms for children with cognitive disabilities.

Bolivia: Our *Message of Hope* project aims to present 2 000 Guaraní children with a message of hope using Biblical material kits. Please pray that each child who receives the package will be blessed. Also, pray for the volunteers who supported us in delivering the kits.

Paraguay: Many people in our country cannot afford to buy Bibles. Please pray for our project to provide Scriptures for these audiences to enhance their growth in faith and spirituality, warding off destructive cultural behaviours. More and more people will

come to Christ through discipleship from watching the *Jesus Film*, and *Faith Comes by Hearing*. Pray for God's blessing on the donors of this project.

14 April – 20 April

Brazil: Our *Fostering Values in Schools* project hopes to foster the revival of ethical and social values through the teachings of the Holy Bible. We also wish to develop a culture of peace within school communities. Please pray that Brazilian law will become more tolerant toward using the Bible in schools.

Peru: Please pray for our project that centres on enabling thousands of people who live in remote communities in the Peruvian highlands to know Jesus Christ through printed Bible material. Pray for the indigenous pastors and leaders participating in the project.



21 April – 27 April

Ecuador: Ecuador is home to about 24 000 blind people, and braille is an essential everyday tool for a high percentage of this population. Please pray for our project to implement 12 braille Bible-reading clubs and that blind communities will know the love of God and learn directly from His Word.

Chile: Our *Born to Love* project offers professional assistance to promote Christian family values among children and teenagers, focusing on healing family relationships and developing training in the prevention of sexual abuse and the healing process of trauma. Please pray for Chilean children, their families so they can find the path to the Lord and transform their lives.

28 April – 4 May

North Korea: Please pray for the economic development of North Korea, as approximately 60% of the population lives in extreme poverty. Pray that the

people here will gain access to food and primary healthcare and that more people will accept Christ into their hearts and experience freedom, peace and joy in Him.

South Korea: Please continue to pray for Bible work in our country and that we will strengthen our goal to serve Korean churches. Pray that our mission to share God's Word through translation, publication and various programmes will be successful and help people live out God's Word in their daily lives.

Japan: Please pray for the continued success of Japanese Bible work as we endeavour to spread the Gospel and share God's Word. Pray for the ongoing translation of the Bible into Japanese Sign Language, especially for the translation team and their families.

5 May – 11 May

China Partnership: Please pray for our project to provide

Bible paper to support the Church in China in printing and distributing more Bibles to the growing number of Chinese people coming to know Jesus. Pray for annual approval from the authorities to issue Bible print permits and that the Word of God will help readers to grow in their understanding and belief in Jesus Christ.

Mongolia: Please pray for our *Braille Window Project* to bring light into the lives of people with visual disabilities by teaching them how to read and engage them with the Word of God. Pray that people with visual disabilities will see the light of God and bring hope through Scripture training.

Nepal: Only about 1,76% of our population are practising Christians. Pray that our projects to empower citizens with the knowledge of Christ will be widespread and successful. Pray that literacy rates in Nepal will improve and that more people will have access to the Word of God through Bible work.

12 May – 18 May

Malaysia: Please pray for our mission to make the Bible available to all Malaysians to engage them with the Word of God and advocate Bible ministry to people from other faith groups. Pray that we can foster a closer relationship with local churches to produce digital Bible material to meet the needs of the new generation.

Thailand:

The majority of Thai people do not have any knowledge of Christianity or the Bible, and Christians constitute only 1,2% of over 71 million inhabitants. Pray for the success of our vision to see every Thai person with a Bible and the skills to use it. Pray for our translation and distribution efforts and advocacy initiatives as we help Thai Christians understand and appreciate the Scriptures.

Myanmar:

Please pray for our continued efforts to translate the Bible into the heart languages of all our fellow citizens. Pray for our vision to provide Scripture resources and make the Word of God available in various formats through collaboration with other agencies.

19 May – 25 May

Cambodia: Our literacy programme, *Learning Through Listening*, addresses a lack of literacy among Cambodians. Please pray for the programme's impact in the provinces, for new strategies to implement the programme, and that God will use His Word to bring salvation to students and spiritual growth to believers.

Vietnam: Vietnam is a nominal Buddhist country controlled by communist ideologies and economic rent-seekers. Please pray for the availability of the Bible and its meaningful use among the people inhabiting Vietnam and their diasporic communities.

Laos: There are still many restrictions on religious freedom in our country. Please pray that we will be able to establish a Bible Society office in the future and that we will be able to empower younger generations with Biblical knowledge and values.

26 May – 1 June

Norway: Please continue to pray for the Norwegian Bible Society's mission to make the Bible more freely available. Pray for our goal to make the Bible present and visible in churches and general society by 2025.

Finland: Praise God for the success of all our current and past literacy projects. Please pray that the Finnish Bible Society can meet our goals, promote awareness, and raise interest in the Word of God. Pray that we can complete all our running programmes and

make more Bibles available at affordable prices.

Sweden: Please keep praying for our staff and ongoing Bible work in our country as we work toward ensuring the Bible is translated, made available and frequently used in Sweden. Pray that more people will come to know God's Word in their heart language and that more people will support the Bible Society's work.

2 June – 8 June

Portugal: Following the success of our *Digital Transformation Roadmap*, we want to take the next step in helping people engage digitally with the Bible text and other resources. Please pray that we can reach different audiences through this initiative.

France: As our country becomes more secular and Christianity is often rejected, we face a more significant challenge to spread God's Word and show how relevant the Bible is. Please pray that we can reach more hearts with the Holy Scriptures. Pray for our efforts to provide inclusive Biblical tools such as podcasts, books for migrants and Bibles adapted for people experiencing homelessness.

Spain: The Bible Society's mission is to disseminate the Bible to all people who want to approach it and to ensure there is no barrier that prevents them from doing so. Please pray for our projects to translate and revise Biblical text and work toward producing Scriptures in different languages and formats.



9 June – 15 June

Denmark: Please pray that more Danish people will reconnect with the Word of God and that the Scriptures will profoundly impact our communities. Pray especially for our translation projects and that Bible engagement will increase, particularly among our nation’s youth.

Faroe Islands: The Faroese Bible Society operates in an island community with 54 000 citizens. Please pray that Bible work in our region will impact many lives and that we can provide Bibles and Biblical materials in multiple translations and forms of media.

Iceland: The Icelandic Bible Society aims to publish, distribute and encourage the use of the Bible and ensure that the Bible is always available in Icelandic at an affordable price. Please pray for our

efforts to raise the profile of the Bible and that Icelandic citizens will return to the pages of God’s Word.

16 June – 22 June

Scotland: Continue to pray for the health and well-being of our staff and their families as we work diligently to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the people of Scotland. Pray that the Word of God will spread among the youth and filter into future generations as a beacon of hope.

NEW BOOK DELVES INTO Bible translation in Southern Africa

A new book from the Bible Society of South Africa (BSSA) documents the significant history of Bible translation projects in numerous indigenous languages.

Lighting the Lamp on the Pathway of Life was written by Dr Eric Hermanson, who retired as the BSSA's Assistant General Secretary of Translation and Text Processing in 2005.


The book looks at the Bible translation project in 23 Bantu, Khoi and San languages in South Africa, Botswana) Lesotho, Swaziland and Namibia, in which the BSSA had regional offices before those countries became independent and instated autonomous Bible Societies.

The book also documents various versions of the Bible in Afrikaans, published between 1983 and 2020.

The 320-page book includes 120 photographs of the translators, many members of various review committees and ample footnotes. It is written for anyone interested in knowing how the Bible originated in Southern African languages. It will also be of great value

to those who want more information about Bible translation in their home language.

The proposed publication date for the printed book is 1 April 2024, but it will be available online in digital format from *Amazon* and *Kobo* beforehand.
